This is a dance and movement opportunity for kids developmental age 5-9 who are neurodivergent and/or on the autism spectrum. In this class, local non-profit South Sound Dance Access and local business Sensory Tool House LLC are teaming up to offer an engaging, playful, and nurturing space for dance and movement. Lacey Teen Late Nights provide 6th, 7th, and 8th graders in the North Thurston Public Schools District a fun-filled night of activities that just about every teen is bound to find something they enjoy. RAC Parking Lot Improvements Underway

In early December, the gravel lot in the northwest corner (Marvin Rd SE and Steilacoom Rd SE, see photo on left) of the Regional Athletic Complex (RAC) closed for construction of a new asphalt parking lot and other site improvements. The lot will remain closed to the public until June 2024. The project includes stormwater improvements, grading, paving, installing various site furnishings, and landscaping. When finished, the new parking lot will have more than 340 parking stalls including six electrical vehicle charging stations, eight accessible parking stalls (ADA), and eight bus stalls. In addition to the parking lot, Steilacoom Rd SE frontage improvements will include a sidewalk, bike lane, associated stormwater facilities, street lights, street trees, and other landscaping.

Program Description

Ever wanted to learn more about your family history but had no idea how to get started or where to go for information? Join Dr. Jewell Lorenz Dunn as she shares the basics on what you need to begin your family tree research. Genealogy is much more than just online census records. Learn what the Washington State Archives has to help you in your search and where else you can find vital information.

Speaker Bio

Dr. Jewell Lorenz Dunn works in the Research department at the Washington State Archives, specializing in genealogy and property research. Jewell's first foray into genealogy was at age 15, when she was invited by her maternal aunt to help record oral histories with great uncles who were born in the late 1880's. She was immediately hooked and soon took over the mantle of family genealogist. In 1985, her job was transferred to Utah, where she solidified her love for genealogy and strengthened her research skills. Jewell has over 23 years of experience using the collections at the Washington State Archives, and has been helping researchers in Olympia since 2015.
