Ape Caves and Trail of Two Forests (13 - 17 yrs)

Explore the south side of Mount St. Helens National Volcanic Monument. We start with the Trail of Two Forests, a short .5-mile loop through two side by side forests. Next, we will hit the Ape Cave Interpretive Site, the 3rd largest lava tube in the United States. We will hike the lower cave option an easy 1.5-mile round trip walk, which houses a popular geologic anomaly known as the Meatball.

Wear sturdy shoes or boots because the tube bed is rough and uneven! The cave temperature is a constant 42 degrees, the ceiling is drippy, and it's completely dark-- so dress warm in layers and bring a powerful flashlight or headlamp. We will end the day at a park on Yale Lake for lunch. Pack a picnic lunch, snacks, and plenty of drinking water.

Did You Know?

We have a 2.2 mile paved trail through the center of downtown Lacey!

The Lacey Karen Fraser Woodland Trail, for pedestrians and bicycles, parallels Pacific Avenue connecting *Woodland Creek Community Park* on the east and the *Chehalis-Western* and *Olympia Karen Fraser Woodland Trails* on the west.
